USEFUL INFORMATION

BLUE BADGE REFORM: Public Consultation

The Scottish Government are proposing to reform the Blue Badge Scheme and are seeking views on their plans. The proposed changes are meant to reflect the significant social changes that have taken place over the past 40 years, and to ensure the Scheme is administered efficiently, consistently and fairly.

CARERS CREDIT: Could it help you?

If you are caring for someone for 20 hours or more a week but don't get Carer's Allowance or Income Support as a carer, you could qualify for new National Insurance credits to protect your State Pension.
