
Helensburgh & Lomond Carers Project 10th Anniversary 2010 - Ten Years of Caring for Carers

Helensburgh & Lomond Carers Project 10th Anniversary

Funded by Awards For All Scotland and Argyll & Bute Leisure Development Grant, the launch of our 10 Events for Carers campaign coincides with **Carers Week 14th – 20th June 2010**. Celebrations include a Fashion Show, various trips and fundraising events culminating with a fabulous James Bond themed ball for carers and supporters of the project on 26 November at Cameron House, Loch Lomond.

The campaign however, has a serious message. Services for unpaid carers need to remain and expand in the Helensburgh and Lomond area. The project has recently commissioned a feasibility study to research the setting up of a service for young carers. Proceeds from the campaign will help us to continue supporting carers in Helensburgh and Lomond.

10 Facts about Carers

- Carers save the Scottish Government £7.68 billion a year.
- There are almost 6 million carers in the UK (1 in 10 people) and just over 657,000* in Scotland.
- There are 1.25 million carers in the UK who care for some one for more than 50 hours a week (a full-time workforce greater than the NHS).
- The definition of a an unpaid carer is someone who looks after a partner, relative or friend who is ill, frail, disabled or has mental health or substance misuse problems and who can't manage without their help.
- Carer's allowance is £53.10 a week (£1.52 an hour) the lowest benefit of its kind.
- Three in five of us will become carers at some point in our lives.
- Three-quarters of carers struggle to pay utility bills and more than half of them need to cut back on food and heating to make ends meet.
- Three-quarters of carers say their health is worse because of their caring responsibilities.
- There are 10,790* carers in the Argyll and Bute Council area.
- There are approximately 2,600* carers in Helensburgh & Lomond
