


Have fun and get pampered while helping us raise some funds! Join us for our Pamper Night at the Carers Centre.

Carers Allowance There has been a change to how Carers Allowance looks at full time education. If the carer says they are in full time education the education establishment will be asked if they are studying for more than 21hrs per week, this will include; receiving instruction or tuition, supervised study, examination of practical work, taking part in any exercise, experiment or project which forms part of the course. If they are told the full time study is for more than 21hrs per week they will disallow Carers Allowance, if the study is less than 21hrs per week a decision will be made on the information provided from the place of study.
